4.0 DISCUSSION/ACTION

4.1 State of California, 2017 OHV Planning and Restoration Grant Programs

- Dan Keyes talked about the RFP review process for the Regional Park Access Control Project and recommended for the committee to take a few days to study the proposals and schedule interviews with both proposing firms prior to the MCRPD Board meeting on October 18, 2017.
- Kirk Marshall agreed to the concept of taking the time to study the proposals and scheduling interviews.
- John Huff expressed some surprise to the idea of waiting and explained that he was under the impression that the proposals were going to be reviewed at this meeting and a decision would be made as to which proposing firm would be recommended for the contract award to the MCRPD Board.
- Sarah Huff was also surprised to hear about a possible delay in the decision making process.
- A general consensus was agreed upon to schedule interviews on Wednesday, October 18, 2017 starting at 10:00 a.m.
- Dan Keyes will schedule the firms in writing and prepare a rating sheet based on the criteria of the selection process contained within the RFP.
- Sarah Huff provided an update regarding the Districts grant match to date and does not believe the District will have any problem meeting their share. Equipment donations to date have a value of \$3,370, while the planning grant has \$520.76 in match value.
- Sarah Huff talked about the restoration grant and the necessary environmental clearance, which has been received and she is hoping to have the agreement before the end of the day.
- John Huff provided an update on Dan Canfield, State Biologists.
- A general discussion was held in regards to the UTV quotes.
- Dan said three timely quotes had been received.

- John Huff asked Jason Silva about his opinion as a UTV mechanic about the associated maintenance with a Can-Am. Jason responded that he was not in favor of this brand due to high than average maintenance and operating expense.
- Sarah Huff expressed concerns with Ukiah Motorsports based on their past history.
- A decision was made to delay the confirmation of the UTV purchase until John Huff had time to conduct a more research.

4.2 State of California, 2017 Cal Recycles Grant

- Sarah Huff said that we still have not received word on the outcome of the grant selection and award process.
- John Huff requested to be informed as soon as possible in the hopes that grant funds can be used to remove debris in the flat area of the property.
- A general discussion was held in regards to debris and pick-up.
- Dan Keyes briefly talked about the pending RFPs for the concrete removal and the EIR.
